Immersion Charter School Opens Its Doors



MISD opened a new immersion school this fall. The new charter school is called Kaehkēnawapatāēq, which means "We learn by observing."

For the first year, its two classrooms are for pre-K and Kindergarten students, with hopes of expanding the school one grade/one classroom per year moving forward. Many of the students have previous exposure to the Menominee language through an immersion program offered at daycare.

Waqnahwew (Ben Grignon), the Menominee Nation's language and culture coordinator, and Menominee language immersion instructors,

Kākekāēcewan (Kara Besaw) and Mīhicēh (JayCee Tourtillott) are all involved with and teach at the school.

Grignon recently told Wisconsin Public Radio in an interview, "When the immersion program first started, there were very few, if any, children under 5 who were being raised in the language. Now we have a population at this school of 33 students who will be totally immersed in our language and in our daycare and Head Start."

Language learning comes more naturally for younger children, which is a big advantage. As Besaw explained in the WPR interview, "Things are so different in Menominee language. The way you order your sentences. What's considered animate and inanimate, living and non-living, is different in Menominee than it is in English.

Students will not only be learning Menominee, but keeping it alive for future generations. They will have a better understanding of what it means to be Menominee, and that benefits everyone in the community. Thank you to WPR for shining a spotlight on the school!
