A New Home for the New High School

After careful consideration and extensive analysis, MISD has decided to build the new Menominee Indian High School on the same site as the existing high school, which will then become the middle school.

Why the change from the original idea of building the new school on property behind the Sav-a-Lot? The continuing analysis shows there are many advantages to locating the new school on the existing MISD property, including but not limited to:

- Sharing the site will create a cohesive campus for the District, having students from 5th – 12th grade in the same location.
- From a safety aspect, students will not have to cross a state highway to access amenities like athletic fields and gymnasium space.
- From a resource perspective, staff, equipment, and special amenities can easily be shared between the new high school and what will become the new middle school.
- From an environmental perspective, transportation and busing is consolidated to one site, so the District can tie into the existing site utilities.

The District is excited about the advantages to this solution and are planning on breaking ground in the summer 2023.

As the design progresses, the project team is actively pursuing grants and other incentives to subsidize additional project amenities, specifically sustainability. The project has been enrolled in the Focus on Energy (FOE) Energy Design Assistance program to collaboratively explore and quantify alternative energy-related systems, equipment and building envelope materials with the goal of selecting strategies that are cost effective and yield the highest lifecycle value to the District.

The cash incentives obtained through this program will be used to offset the initial capital costs associated with the energy-efficiency strategies. Furthermore, the project team continues to search for other grant and incentive opportunities that are applicable to the project. One example is the Cellcom grant, which is featured on page 2 of the newsletter.
