Serving Students Now & In the Future *Facility Referendum April 5*

For the past year and a half, the Menominee Indian School District School Board has studied facility needs in the district. Current facilities don't adequately meet changing and evolving educational requirements, growing enrollment and technology needs. The Board has been working with financial and construction consultants to develop a master facility plan while evaluating options and cost estimates. District leadership also met with the Menominee Tribal Legislature to discuss a land swap that will be needed to make the master facility plan a reality. MTL has agreed to work with the District to make that happen.

So after careful consideration, and with the support of MTL, the Board has now approved moving forward with a voter referendum. The referendum, to be held April 5, asks voters to approve up to \$35 million in general obligation bonds to pay for the construction of a new high school, converting the existing high school into a middle school, improvements to the elementary school and equipment related to these projects.

In the coming months, community members will have multiple opportunities to learn more about the specifics of the facility plan, and the referendum, as the District will be holding virtual meetings and providing background information.

Please take time to learn more about this important project which will address current as well as future needs of the District. Finally, don't forget to vote on April 5.

School Board Election on April 5

In addition to the school referendum, there will be a school board election on April 5 to fill two seats, one at-large representative and one seat representing Neopit. Watch for more information in future newsletters.
