The FRESH Project purchases locally grown produce and meats from rural farmers and sets up mobile markets in nine locations of Shawano and Menominee counties. In addition, the organization does outreach and education with local schools; and that's what brought the project to KPS.

The FRESH Project's Dave and Barb Mendoza worked with students throughout the month of May to help them learn about gardening and plants. Among the many activities they participated in, students took seeds and put them into soil pods to get them ready for the school garden.

This effort will continue during Summer School when the Garden Club will plant and harvest from the garden as they continue learning about fruits, vegetables, soil and other subjects connected to gardening.

Interesting + Engaging + Educational = Summer School

Summertime learning doesn't have to be a chore. MISD is focused on making summer school interesting, engaging and educational for everyone. Summer school, for MIHS & MIMS, starts on Monday June 6, and will run Monday through Thursday mornings (8 a.m. – Noon), until July 7. All classes will be in-person, with breakfast and lunch provided.

For the **High School**, classes will be hands on and, for each class a student completes, they will earn a ½ credit. MIHS students can sign up for one elective, one core class and one P.E. class. At **MIMS**, students will be able to choose from a wide variety of classes and learning activities such as cooking, gardening, cultural arts and games, robotics and more.

KPS summer school runs 8 a.m. to Noon, Mondays through Thursdays, June 13-July 21, with breakfast and lunch provided. Classes will focus on math and literacy, incorporated into unique and fun activities.

"Summer gives us the opportunity to do things a little differently than during the regular school year," explained Superintendent Wendell Waukau. "All of the classes and activities incorporate important skills. It's an educational boost all the way around."

Bus transportation will be provided to students living within the district boundaries. For students living in Shawano, transportation will be arranged through Menominee Tribal transit system.
